



How to use Facebook to Find an English-Speaking Job in Israel

Instructions: Follow each step *exactly* as written to maximize your chances to find a job using the Facebook website

Step 1:

Decide what kind of job you want - Before starting to look for a job, you should have a clear picture of the type of work that you would want to do. No need to be overly specific, but at least an occupational field that you could realistically pursue.

Step 2:

Make sure your CV looks good

Step 3:

Join Facebook groups

Step 4:



Go through Facebook groups - As I am sure you have noticed, many of the various Facebook groups have the same job offerings. However, not all of them do! Take 3-4 minutes per group, and thoroughly comb through ALL of the Facebook groups.

Step 5:

Write down the company name and job position you want there

***** Tip:** I highly recommend doing this for every single enticing job listing that you see. You should have a decent list after you go through all of the Facebook groups.

Step 6:

Use Google to find a phone number for the company - After you have a few company names with open positions written down in your notebook go onto Google, and find the phone numbers for the companies. Why? Because you are going to call them soon. You are going to go above & beyond the regular efforts of the typical job-hunter, and follow up.

Step 7:



Fill job application online - Send over your CV to email address provided, or you might have to visit the website of the place that is hiring to fill out the job application for the position.

***** Tip:** While on the company website, you might as well check out other open positions / job listings the company has. Who knows what you might find!

Step 8:

Call the company HR department - Right after you send over your CV, call the company HR department to follow up on it.

***** Key Thing:** If blocked/stopped from speaking with the HR manager, repeat Step 8 daily until you get to speak with someone in HR department. Don't let NOONE stop you!

Step 9:

Repeat daily and stay persistent

***** Tip:** If you haven't had success after reasonable efforts, your CV needs work... or you need to apply for a different type of job... or both.
